## 2023-2024 Budget & The Current Educational Climate

- New York State (NYS) budget deadline of April 1, 2023 for aid finalization.
- Balance health and wellness supports for WCSD students and staff continuing to personalize the educational experience by maintaining staffing levels and educational opportunities in challenging times.
- Maintain our current educational program by supporting academic supports, academic enrichment opportunities, extra-curricular activities, as well as professional development for staff.

## 2023-2024 Budget – What we know so far...

#### Consumer Price Index (CPI) is 8.0%

- Since the CPI exceeds 2%, the District will utilize 2% in the tax cap formula.
- Completion of the tax cap calculation has resulted in a 2.05% maximum allowable tax levy increase.
- Currently, the District has balanced the 2023-2024 budget using a tax levy increase of 1.67%. This is .38% less than the allowable tax levy increase and utilizes General Fund Balance.

#### New York State (NYS) Governor's Executive Budget Proposal:

- Includes the re-instatement of the Foundation Aid formula.
- Universal Pre-K (UPK) funding remains stable in this proposal.
- Currently, the District is budgeting using the full Governor's Executive Budget Proposal.

## 2023-2024 Budget

What does a 7.86% budget-to-budget increase mean to a WCSD taxpayer?

**GOOD NEWS:** The tax levy increase is what impacts WCSD taxpayers & is currently at 1.67% over the 2022-2023 amount.

**MORE GOOD NEWS:** Since WCSD is proposed to receive increased NYS Aid under the Governor's Executive Budget and is also utilizing Fund Balance for the K-8 Special Education Initiative, the budget-to-budget increase of 7.86% is not solely the taxpayers responsibility!

## 2023-2024 Budget – K-8 Special Education Initiative

The District is utilizing General Fund Balance in completing the 2023-2024 budget

• WCSD is meeting the needs of Special Education students through the K-8 Special Education Initiative

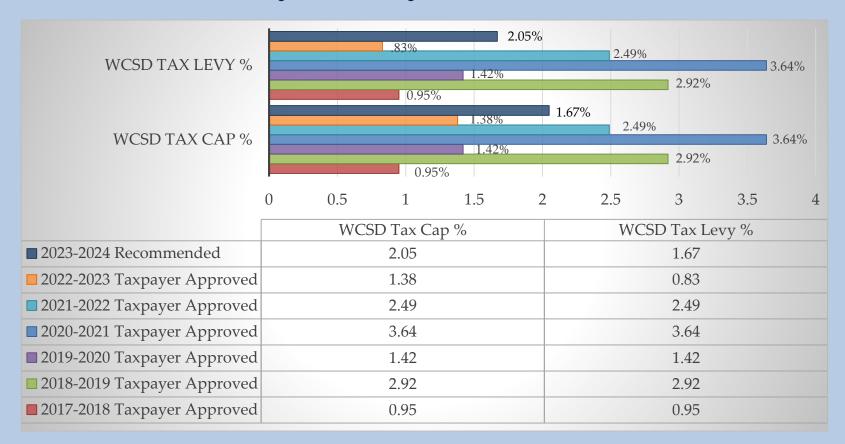
#### What is the K-8 Special Education Initiative and what does it include?

- At six elementary schools WCSD has a shared Kindergarten & Grade 1 Special Education Teacher
  - To address the learning loss that our students have endured, having two full-time teachers in the classroom is imperative
  - Included in the plan: addition of six elementary Special Education Teachers; one each at Vassar Road, Sheafe Road, Myers Corners, Fishkill Plains, Gayhead, and Brinckerhoff
- Wappingers Jr High and Van Wyck Jr High Schools have shared one Assistant Director for Special Education
  - Due to the volume of students and the differentiated needs of the students, both Wappingers JHS and Van Wyck JHS will each have one dedicated Assistant Director of Special Education to provide for smaller case loads, which will enhance personalized educational services.

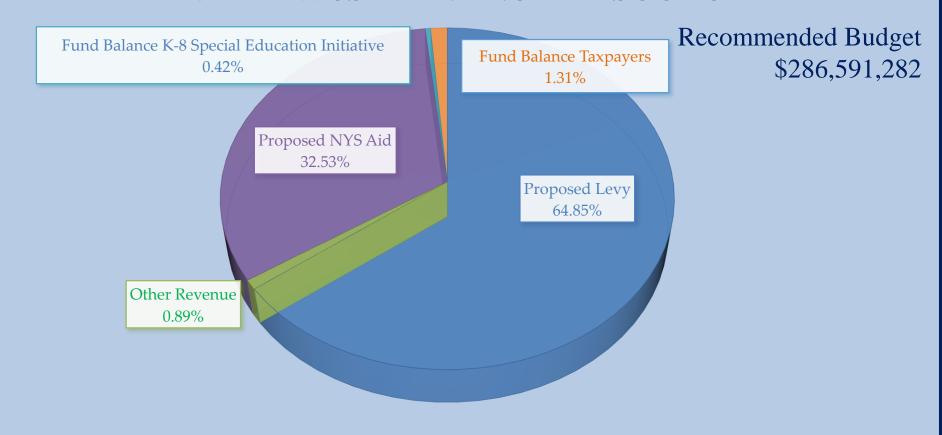

These are not new positions.</li> <li>Converting the Public Information Officer from part-time to full-time with the District.</li> <li>Converting 10 bus driver positions and 1 courier position from part-time to full-time.</li> <li>Additional 1.0 Special Education Account Clerk to assist with the increased reporting and expenditure processing in that Department.</li> <li>NYS district-level building project work, as needed.</li> <li>Funding for junior high welding rooms.</li> </ul>	

## WCSD Levy History 2017-2018 to 2023-2024



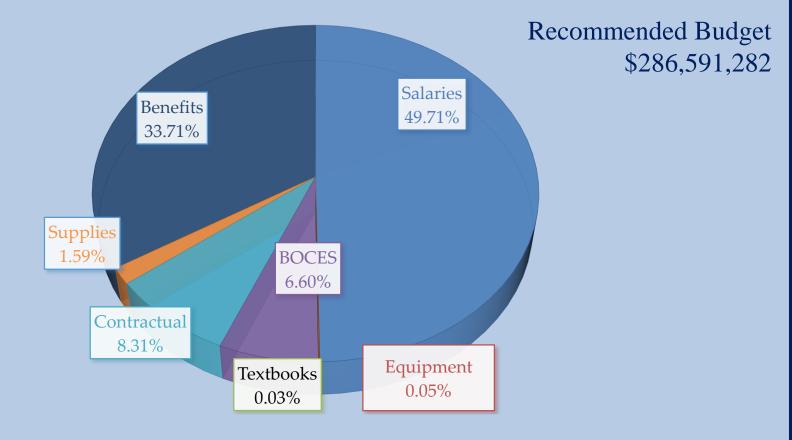

## 2023-2024 WCSD REVENUE BY SOURCE



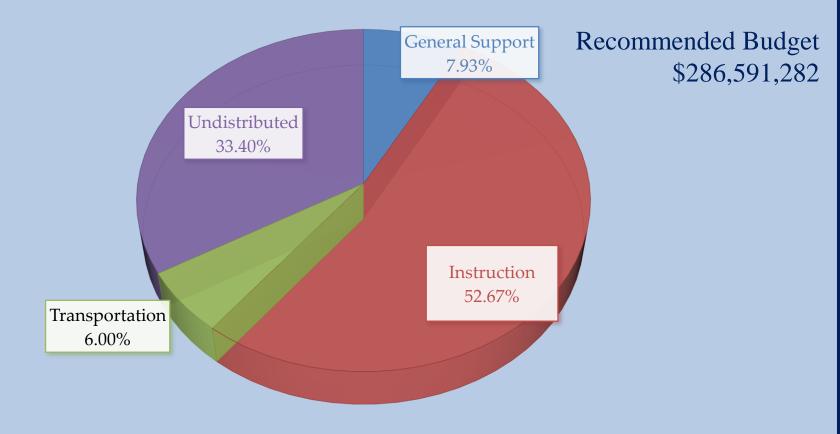
