School Taxes & Assessment Process TIMELINE

Local (Municipal Decisions)

Municipalities provide a final assessment roll to WCSD by mid July. The assessment roll lists the assessed value of every property in the municipality.

Calculations

WCSD sets tax rates for each municipality based on three factors: voter approved tax levy; state determined final equalization rates; and local municipality assessment rolls.

While all property is assessed, not all property is taxable. For example, seniors, persons with disabilities, veterans, volunteer firefighters and EMS may qualify for an exemption on part of their homes as well as homeowners eligible for the STAR program. School Decisions

WCSD proposes a school budget to voters annually in May. This budget includes a proposed tax levy, which reflects the total amount to be collected from taxpayers in the school district.

WCSD has presented tax levys for taxpayer approval <u>below</u> the tax cap for the last three years!

State Decisions

NYS finalizes equalization rates for each municipality. An equalization rate represents the state's determination of the level of property assessments in a given municipality in relation to full market values.

Printing and Mailing

Tax bills are printed for each property owner based on their property's assessment.
